



### ABOUT THE OPPORTUNITY

In accordance with the established strategic plans, goals, and objectives of the Heiltsuk Tribal Council, and in relationship with partners, the key mandate of this management position is to ensure the organization implements its short, mid, and long-range housing strategy to achieve its goals and objectives in relation to public works operations and its related staffing and maintenance and preventative maintenance programs and services to promote quality of place and quality of life for residents.

As a boots-on-the-ground manager, the Public Works Manager will oversee the management and delivery of municipal-type services including water treatment and distribution, wastewater collection and treatment, drainage systems maintenance, roadways maintenance, and byways and greenways and parks and cemetery, marina and wharf. Key responsibilities include planning, organizing, directing, and controlling, and evaluating key areas of operations and maintenance, budgets, and the performance management of employees. Other key responsibilities include compliance reporting, reporting to funders, authorized engagement with partners to support funding agreements and services procurement, planning for succession, and making technical recommendations.

This is an overtime exempt position. This employee will work a regular schedule of 40 hours per week, and on occasion will work beyond these hours, and all remuneration paid to the successful candidate is intended to cover all hours worked.
